

Do you want to inspire children to get engaged in the fight against climate change? Sign up to become a Climate Ed volunteer!

<u>Climate Ed</u> teaches children about climate change and empowers them to take action. We're a charity offering free education to children about climate science, carbon literacy and climate action.

We've been delivering our programme in London primary schools since 2021 and have reached over 10,000 children in that time! In 2023-24, 84% of children participating in the programme said it made them feel positive about how they could help with climate change; and 81% said it had inspired them to take action with their families to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions.

Excitingly, we have an opportunity to expand our programme into Oxfordshire and so are looking for expressions of interest from local volunteers to work with primary schools in the academic year 2024-25.

What do Climate Ed volunteers do?

You will go to a primary school in the Oxford area to deliver a workshop programme about climate change/carbon footprints and inspire the children to start taking action! This involves:

- Undertaking a short remote training session to gain familiarity with the materials.
- Delivery of a programme of workshops (five in total, each lasting one hour) during school hours. (You won't manage the students alone the teacher remains with you the whole time).
- Providing feedback to Climate Ed about the effectiveness of the programme.
- Conducting a follow-up evaluation with the workshop participants two months after the end of the programme to see how much CO2 they have saved.

What makes a good Climate Ed volunteer?

- People who are knowledgeable about the science of climate change (and/or related environmental/sustainability issues), keen to share their knowledge with others, and are able to inspire children to inspire their families to reduce their carbon footprints.
- People who enjoy interacting with children and answering their questions.
- People who like running workshops and are good at engaging others. Experience with young people is ideal but not essential.

We require volunteers to be aged 18 or over. Climate Ed has a robust safeguarding policy and all volunteers are thoroughly vetted and require a DBS check.
