And this guy changed. He was literally on fire. And we noticed him because he was really different. All of us were doing our normal job, but he was running around the classroom. He was different from everybody else because he was on fire. He also was telling everybody, he's going, my lab coat's on fire. He was yelling at the top of his voice, telling everybody that he's on fire. He spoke about it.

And thirdly, he moved. I mean, he was running around. Don't know why he didn't stop. And that made me think, well, he was on fire. He was different from everybody else. He told other people about his issue. He was telling people he's on fire. And lastly, he moved. He didn't stay static.

And when I look at Acts chapter two, it talks about the Holy Spirit coming on that early church and it says, with tongues of fire. And when I look at those three elements, that happened. That's what happens when the Holy Spirit sets on fire. The early church was different because Jesus was living in them.

The early church, they told people, said, you've got to believe in Jesus. They had a boldness in their faith. And lastly, they didn't stay static. They didn't say, well, we're happy here. They moved and moved and spread. And I'm a Christian today because that early church was on fire.
