Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction





Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction is a beautiful and contemplative liturgy in which we are invited to spend time in God's presence, as we simply gaze upon him present in the Eucharist, before receiving his blessing.

The liturgy includes scripture, songs, and responses, and most notably, periods of waiting on the Spirit and extended silence. We use candles to remind us of the light of Christ shining as a beacon of hope into the world, and incense to honour the holy mysteries and as a symbol of our prayers rising before God.

Please feel free to respond in whatever way is most comfortable and natural for you. You may wish to kneel, or to sit or even prostrate yourself on the floor - or you may prefer to remain seated. You may wish to join in with the songs, or simply to listen contemplatively.

This is a holy space, aiming to enable personal encounter with God, and you are free to take from it whatever you wish to. You are simply invited to enter into it with open hearts and minds, and to know that God is present in this place in whatever way you understand this to be the case.

May God's unconditional love surround you and may your soul rest in his presence this evening.
