

In this final Eucharist of the conference, we draw together all that we have learned and experienced in the past few days and receive God's blessing and commissioning, sending us out for the sake of God's world.

We are honoured to have a keynote sermon from The Rt Revd Dr Howard Gregory OJ, Archbishop of the West Indies until his retirement at the end of 2024. Bishop Gregory was elected as Archbishop of the West Indies in May 2019, having served as Bishop of Montego Bay from 2002 to 2012 and then as Bishop of Jamaica and the Cayman Islands from 2012.

There are suggestions for posture throughout the service, maintaining the ancient tradition of standing for praise and collective prayer. These are invitations rather than suggestions, and you are always welcome to remain seated or to take up a more comfortable posture.

Communion will be administered at various stations around the Derbyshire Hall. Gluten-free wafers are available. In line with the diocesan guidance, please do not intinct (dip) your wafer in the chalice: this does not protect either you or others, and affects those who have problems with gluten.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Birinus, Frideswide and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord: by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Behold the Lamb who bears our sins away, slain for us: and we remember: the promise made that all who come in faith find forgiveness at the cross.

So we share in this bread of life, and we drink of his sacrifice, as a sign of our bonds of peace

around the table of the King.
