Policy on Conduct and Safeguarding: Clergy Conference with Visiting Young People

Event: Oxfordshire Clergy Conference 2025

Location: The Hayes Conference Centre, Swanwick, Derbyshire

Date: 13–15 May 2025

Audience: Attending clergy, visiting school pupils, clergy family members (including

children)

1. Purpose of the Policy

This policy outlines conduct expectations for clergy attending the Oxfordshire Clergy Conference 2025, particularly regarding interactions with minors. These include:

- Secondary school pupils leading and participating in worship and workshops during the event.
- Children of clergy attending with their parents or guardians.

The purpose of this policy is to uphold the **highest standards of safeguarding**, ensure **appropriate boundaries**, and foster a **safe and welcoming environment for all**.

2. Safeguarding Responsibilities

- The Diocese of Oxford's safeguarding principles apply throughout the event.
- Two **Designated Safeguarding Officers (DSO)** will be present at the conference: Susie Sigsworth and Yvonne Morris
- Any concerns regarding conduct or safeguarding should be reported immediately to one of the DSOs.

3. Expectations of Clergy Conduct

Clergy are expected to model respectful, professional, and appropriate behaviour at all times, especially when engaging with children and young people.

Clergy must:

- Treat all young people and children with dignity, respect, and fairness.
- Maintain appropriate physical and emotional boundaries at all times.
- Interact with young people in group settings or public spaces only never alone or in private.

- Allow space for pupils and children to participate voluntarily, without pressure or expectation.
- Speak and behave in a manner that is **age-appropriate**, **non-discriminatory**, and mindful of the power dynamic between adults and young people.
- Avoid sharing personal contact details (e.g. phone numbers, social media accounts) with minors.
- Refer any pastoral conversations or concerns regarding minors to their school staff or the designated safeguarding contact.

Clergy must not:

- Initiate **physical contact** (e.g. hugs, shoulder touches) with minors outside of their own family
- Offer **lifts** to minors without express consent from their school or parents and the prior knowledge of the conference DSO.
- Invite unaccompanied minors into private rooms or secluded spaces.
- Take **photographs** or videos of minors or including minors without prior consent from their school and the conference organisers.
- Assume pastoral responsibility for any child or young person unless specifically arranged.
- Exchange contact details with minors.

4. Children of Clergy Attendees

Clergy bringing their children to the conference remain **fully responsible** for their children's care, supervision, and conduct throughout the event.

- Children should remain under the **direct supervision** of their parent or another designated adult.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring their children do not inadvertently enter adult-only sessions or unsupervised areas.

5. Supervision of Visiting School Groups

Visiting pupils will be accompanied by teachers and school staff, who retain
pastoral and safeguarding responsibility for their students during their time at
the conference.

• Clergy may participate in workshops or discussions with school groups but are not responsible for their supervision or behaviour.

6. Breach of Policy

Any breach of this policy will be taken seriously and may result in:

- A formal discussion with conference organisers.
- Referral to the **Diocesan Safeguarding Team**.
- Removal from the conference, depending on the nature and seriousness of the breach.

7. Summary

Clergy attending the conference are reminded that **children and young people are guests in our shared space** and must be treated with care, dignity, and respect. Our collective conduct reflects our commitment to a Church that is **safe for all and protective of the vulnerable**.
