Our link with Huhudi began through a private visit by Moulsford residents to Kimberley in September 2007 and an ad hoc meeting with the Cathedral Dean, Fr Brian Beck, and Bishop Ossie Swartz. The gift at the end of the meeting was a postcard showing a semi-derelict church in Huhudi, Vryburg which needed rebuilding to accommodate a growing congregation. By 2010 links between Moulsford and Huhudi had grown significantly and both parishes agreed to move towards an open ended Partnership rather than

a project driven Link with the rebuilding of the church as its main focus. The additional aims included the exchange of a monthly prayer and the ring fencing of resources for children's ministry within the support funds from Moulsford.

In the following years each review of the Partnership strengthened its mission to both parish communities, joint outreach work to two schools, prayer and worship. This was formalised in 2016 by bringing activities together under the generic title of 'Feed my Sheep'.

The work of the Spirit has continued to bless the Partnership in spite of Covid-related issues over the past two years. Inevitably Covid-19 caused disappointments and changes to plans but the Partnership has continued to flourish and find new ways of praising God and giving thanks for his many gifts.
